There is open seating, so it is recommended that students arrive by at least 6:15 p.m. in order to obtain seats for their friends.

Please review the following information:

- ▲ Tickets will be sold during all lunches on April 17 for \$125.00 per couple/\$65.00 for a single ticket. April 18th, 21st and 22nd tickets are \$135.00 per couple/\$70 for a single ticket (**checks payable: WWSHS and include student ID number in the memo section**).
- ▲ Beginning March 24th guest registration forms are available in the attendance office, counseling center and main office. **Forms are due April 17th.**
- ▲ WWS students must present a photo ID when purchasing tickets (people who do not attend WWS will not be allowed to purchase tickets). If a WWS student takes a date that does not attend the school, then we are requiring a paper copy of the photo ID from the non WWS student.
- ▲ Students are not allowed to have dates younger than freshman year, and not older than 20 years of age.
- ▲ Freshman and sophomores are allowed to attend the event only if accompanied by a junior or senior.
- ▲ In order to get into the dance you must present a photo ID when signing into prom at the entrance of the hotel.
- ▲ A three course dinner will be served that includes, Wyndham traditional salad of romaine, iceberg, shredded carrots, tomatoes, cucumbers with a ranch or Italian dressing. For the main course there is Chicken Lemon classically sautéed with white wine & fresh capers, served with oven roasted potatoes and fresh seasonal vegetables, rolls and butter. Alternate desserts at every other place setting to consist of: raspberry cheesecake with fresh strawberry-citrus sauce and old fashion chocolate cake with vanilla bean sauce.
- ▲ Nominations for Prom Court will take place on the days students purchase prom tickets. Voting for Prom King and Queen will take place on May 1st and 2nd during all lunch periods. The Junior Class Council will announce the King and Queen at Prom.
- ▲ Prom is a school-sponsored event, which means all rules apply to all students and guests. If you are suspended the week prior to prom, you will not be allowed to attend. **Students are required to follow the dress code at prom**, and of course it will be a smoke-free and alcohol-free event regardless of age.
